WE ARE READY TO PARTY!



- * The PARTY STARTS: Welcome Party at 5:00pm just bring yourself and enjoy this evening of awards, good food and drinks.









Toni's RV tips

I've received a number of calls recently, saying the generator is running, but nothing works. Before panic sets in, check out those circuit breakers on the generator and make sure they are in the ON position. Even shore power events will cause those breakers to switch to the OFF position. If you have a polarity tester in an outlet, you can power to the coach from the generator. Before firing up the AC, be sure to wait a

couple of minutes before activating the AC. If you have a bank of outlets not working, be sure to reset the GFI breaker at the outlet before you go further into why no electricity to a bank of outlets. Try not to over-think a problem. Think simple first, and then work your way in to the complicated thought process.

Blast From The Past - Tips continued

TIPS FOR DISCOVERY MOTOR HOME OWNERS

To improve access to the right hand closet, remove the door, flip the door, and re-hinge on the left-hand side. It will, as does the left-hand door, open from the right.

Add a second shelf to increase storage in the cabinet above the sink (often used for dishes, etc).

If you have the single refrigerator with the pantry shelves, improve access to the pantry by removing the shelves and substituting a pull-out unit of basket-shelves. To allow access, remove the door, flip, and re-hinge on the left.



Improve organization in basement bins by adding a shelf. A 4' x 8' sheet of 3/4" plywood, cut into quarters, fits perfectly. Lay on the structural supports in the bins.



If your front air hose access is too low for easy connection and disconnection, add an extension to it, relocating it higher, making it more accessible from the front opening. Install a hook to hang the 50' hose.

For photos and notes, screw a corkboard (small bulletin board) to the sink side of the door to the toilet. For those "junk drawer items", hang clear plastic pocket organizers inside closet doors.



Convert your steering wheel to a table top using broom hanging clamps on the side close to the dash and a deeper support on the front to level the top.

Assist with exiting from the motor home by adding a long vertical handrail along the right hand side, anchored in the narrow area between the door and the window treatment.

Utilize storage under the sofa by removing the frontal piece and building three drawers.

Replace the "bayonet" door closure on the bottom of the bathroom door (used when closed to the kitchen) with a cabinet magnet closure. It will effectively "grab", even when the coach is not level.

Since so many medicine cabinet items are short, add space by adding additional shelves. To keep items from falling out, install 1" Plexiglas "fences" at the front of each shelf.



To dry clothes in the motor home, purchase and install a retractable clothesline diagonally from the cabinet above the TV to the top of the cabinet above the bed, close to the ceiling.

Store shoes vertically along the front outside base of the bed, beneath the mattress level. String a bungee cord between cup hooks, or purchase the pocket shoe keeper from Campers World, or build your own.

Store hats and other items in the empty space to the front of and accessed from the cabinets above the headboard.

Build and hang a shallow silverware drawer from the end of the table, with a "U" opening to provide for the table leg.


Add a removable extension to your kitchen counter, above the drawers on the left, using the same connective system that is used for the kitchen table. Support with a single leg, which folds flat for storage.



To ease access to the washer/dryer, split both doors and re-hinge to create bi-fold doors.

To increase storage use under the sink, add a shelf. Cut out around the nine.

Well, they finally got me! I have been appointed/elected as Southwestern Vice President. Kicking and screaming didn't do me any good, as I yielded to the powers that be, to help our DOAI organization. It so far hasn't been too bad. In 2019, the National Rally will be held in the Southwest. Susan and I went scouting out possible venues for MaryAnn Crowell, National Rally Master. Whatever is decided on a rally location, it will be a great place to enjoy some good times in the Southwest!

Discovery California went to Death Valley for "Flowers and Golf Rally" April 5th through the 8th at the Longstreet Inn & Casino RV Resort in Amargosa Valley, Nevada, located just outside of the east border of Death Valley.

Prior to the start of the rally, the rally masters, Felix & Suzie Jones, had to bow out due to a death in the family. Did we cancel out? Never! We decided that the Board would take over for the Jones. Everything was so well organized beforehand that the rally went off without a hitch. Eighteen Discoverys descended onto the Longstreet Inn & Casino RV Resort, our largest rally so far.

We had lots of weather; rain, sun, and especially wind. The wind was so strong it lifted 2 popups, both were nailed into the ground with rocks on each anchor, they were completely destroyed! Due to the strong wind there were two nights that we did not get together as everyone hunkered down in their RV or in the Casino. We did eventually manage to have two evening bonfires, the last one was quite spectacular.

Paul Stein, Matt & Susan Cullen, Herb Rickelman, Bill Fedewa, and Frank Petronzio played in a golf tournament at the Furnace Creek Golf Course in Death Valley. This golf course sits at 214 feet below sea level which is the lowest elevation golf course in the world.

A number of us explored the ghost town of Rhyolite. There have been no residents here for more than 100 years. What Rhyolite does have are lots of dilapidated buildings in a wild west setting, with no goods or services. We were lucky the museum was open the day we chose to visit. We took the opportunity to take a group photo with the creepy ghost sculptures. Rhyolite is arguably one of the best ghost towns in all of Nevada.

Upon leaving Rhyolite, I was able to talk a few of us, those with high clearance vehicles and a sense of adventure, to drive the 27-mile long one-way road through Titus Canyon. The road starts off with seven or eight miles of extreme washboard then proceeds west across the Amargosa Valley and up into the Grapevine Mountains. The one way road was way more than a drive. The road has astounding mountains, steep twisting roads with hairpin turns, gorgeous colorful rock formations, lush plant life and cacti, abandoned mines, a dry waterfall, and ancient petroglyphs, but the grand finale was driving through the breathtaking canyon narrows. Along the drive, we stopped and looked around at what was left of the ghost town of Leadfield which "boomed" for less than a year in 1926-27 because the lead deposits bottomed out quickly. All that is left today are a few shacks and a number of mines.

Many of us went to Ash Meadows National Wildlife Refuge, which was only a mile from the RV park. It's the largest remaining oasis in the Mojave Desert. This is a photographer's paradise where ice blue spring pools are a stark contrast against the harsh desert landscape. One of these pools is near an old stone cabin built by Jack Longstreet, a gunslinger from the old west. It pumps out 15 gallons of water per second. Many of these pools and streams are habitats for the pupfish.

Of course when you are in Death Valley, you need to go to Badwater Basin, the lowest point in North America, with an elevation of 282 ft below sea level. Our group took this opportunity for a photo shoot.

Over Memorial Day we tried something different for a rally. We tied our rally around the Big Santa Maria Elk's Rodeo. It appears that roughly half of our members are Elks and in order to stay at the 75th Elk's Rodeo RV Corral Campout every Elk could attend with one guest. We had 9 Discoverys dry camping for 4 days of bone crushing (more on the bone crushing later), action packed thrills. The Elks provided breakfast, dinner, and lots of entertainment to keep everyone as busy as they wanted to be. There were Bloody Marys, karaoke, wine bottle painting, a baseball game with beanbags, dancing, and the Matchbox Car Races.

Our group cheered on Frank Petronzio as the driver for our Matchbox car. First, you needed to be the winner of the auction for the Matchbox car of our liking. Second, Frank and friends modified the car in hopes it will go down the track faster than the other competitors. The first race we won because the competitor's car got stuck at the starting gate. Sadly, we did not win any other races but are looking forward to next time we compete. Brunch included Bloody Marys and in the evening was the Santa Maria style of BBQ, which is famous in this part of the country. You should see the fire pits they used to BBQ chicken and tri-tip.
