Hello, Discovery Owners! My hope is that this letter finds all of you in good health and good spirits.



The lawyer, the registered agent for DOAI in New Mexico, retired and apparently failed to forward correspondence from the state to our organization. Since there was no response, New Mexico terminated our charter. We are establishing procedures to ensure this cannot happen in the future. John Baker, executive vice president, has done a wonderful job researching state requirements. He has prepared the necessary documents to incorporate in Virginia. We will have a DOAI member designated as the registered agent. Virginia requirements are simple and we can easily make member-approved changes to our bylaws. This will eliminate the expense of dealing with a lawyer for these matters. There will need to be bylaw changes presented at the general business meeting in Pueblo.

Our treasurer, Micky Racer, added an income and expense statement in this newsletter as part of the financial statement. Previously, the report was just a balance sheet. The board of DOAI is committed to transparency in the decision-making process and full financial reporting. Board meetings are open to all members. Also, the next elections are less than one year away. If you want to serve in a leadership capacity at the national or regional level, now is the time to start gathering information.

One job of the immediate past president is to head the nominating committee. I know, in the coming months, you will be hearing much more from Phil Yovino about the upcoming elections.

The board has discussed the concept of a low-cost rally focused more on Discovery technical and RV lifestyle seminars. Except for the major manufacturers, seminars would be conducted primarily by fellow DOAI members. This "Camp Discovery" rally concept will be addressed during the next board meeting at the Southeast region rally.

I take this opportunity to thank our national, regional, and chapter officers and directors. You made a choice to become involved in this great organization and contribute your time and effort to serve the members. Thank you very much.

This is the time of the year when many of you have your Discovery in storage for the winter. On these cold days, just keep warm thoughts and a sunny outlook. It will soon be time to de-winterize and get back on the road.

I hope to see you at the 2009 Southeast rally. Take care and God bless.

Southeast Region 2009 Rally "Discover The Smokies"

Final Details by Frank Cason

Those of us in the Southeast region are sure looking forward to welcoming you at the 2009 rally at River Plantation RV Park in Sevierville, Tennessee in April.

Below is the map to help you get to the park, and here's how to interpret it:

On I-40, take Exit 407 and proceed east on Tennessee highway 66 approximately nine miles where you will have to make a right turn. As you go through the town of Sevierville, position your D in the left lane. There will be three lanes of traffic going east through town, and hanging in the center of each traffic light will be a mile marker. These markers tell you how far you are from Gatlinburg.

When you make your right turn (and this is the *only* way you can turn) this light will be mile marker 15.0. The next light will be mile marker 14.8. As soon as you pass this

traffic light, you will be turning *left* at the *second* left turn (the first turn is for a helicopter ride, and you can do this later).

Signs will be posted at mile marker 15.0 and at the turn to the campground to assist you.




Once you arrive at the RV park, you will be greeted by the parking group, which will escort you to your site.


An Extra Perk

Note to Quarter Income and Expenses: Gross income for the 2008 national rally was \$36,697 with \$2,161 in corporate support still outstanding (and not included in gross income). Rally expenses were \$37,770 and the books show a net loss at this time of \$1,073. When outstanding corporate support is received, a net income of \$1,088 will be recorded. DOAI clothing sales at the rally generated \$400. The overall loss is due to the fact that the expenses for the 2008 national rally were paid during the quarter ending October 30, 2008, and the monies came in during previous time periods. *

GOOD NEIGHBOR POLICY

The board of directors of Discovery Owners Association, Inc., met on Friday, September 12, 2008, 3:00 p.m. at Elkhart County 4-H Fairgrounds, Goshen, Indiana.

Present were: Marshall Godwin, president; John Baker, executive vice president; Elsie Sikes, secretary; Phil Yovino, vice president of development; Dick Snyder, national rally master; John Bujnovsky, Southwest region vice president; Frank Cason, Southeast region vice president; Steve Masterson, Northeast region vice president; Charlie Richardson, North Central region vice president; Bob Soltwedel, Northwest region vice president; and Joe Stewart, South Central region vice president.

The meeting was called to order by President Marshall Godwin.

Minutes from the board meeting held January 26, 2008 were read and accepted; minutes from the electronic board meeting on January 2, 2008 were read and accepted.

In the absence of the treasurer, the vice treasurer, Pete Palasota, gave the financial report which indicated net assets of \$85,044. He remarked that the rally fees collected for this rally

should be shown on the report as a liability rather than an asset, since they were being held to pay invoices not yet submitted. Marshall asked Pete to give the financial report at the general meeting with that change to better reflect the association's actual net worth. The treasurer's report was accepted.

The audit committee report was given by chairman Steve Masterson. Steve indicated the committee found no irregularities or improper accounting practices. Without objection, the board approved the following items in the audit:

- Establish a standing audit committee of three members who are not national officers or directors. The terms will be three, two, and one years to provide continuity by overlapping terms.
- Establish elected vice treasurer position as full member of the DOAI board.
- Establish written procedures for financial accounting and audit processes.
- Require chapters to provide an annual financial report due by March 1 each year.
- Ensure funds raised through raffles or other means that might be considered gambling are disbursed to a recognized charity to preserve DOAI's tax exempt status.
- Allow audit committee members read-only access to DOAI accounts.
- Checks payable to the treasurer should be signed by the president.

- DOAI bank statements should be reviewed by the president.
- Establish specific dates for the annual audit

Additional recommendations regarding rally financing and accountability will be incorporated in the next major rally to test the concepts prior to full implementation.



Secretary Elsie

John Baker will develop proposed standing rule revisions to incorporate the changes for audit committee and vice treasurer. Pete and Micky will develop written controls for the treasurer. Dick Snyder will work on suggested changes to standing rule #3, Rallies.

Marshall requested Pete and Micky present options for changing the DOAI bank accounts to a national bank.

Frank Cason gave a report on the plans and budget for the Southeast region rally, April 2009.

Bob Soltwedel gave a report on the 2009 national rally in Pueblo, September 18-24, 2009. He requested help from all chapters for the rally.

Online rally registration is still on hold pending further

investigation on fees with PayPal and/or a fee to those who use it. Implementation for 2009 national rally is forecast.

Steve Masterson presented the *RVers'* Good Neighbor Policy for consideration. The board approved endorsement of this policy. Steve will coordinate with the Escapees to have the DOAI logo shown on their Web site to reflect our endorsement.

The rally handbook is still being compiled.

Nina Soltwedel presented a status report for *Discovery Express*.

Portia Williams provided a membership report that reflected continued member growth.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.



Newsletter Matters

recent issue of Costco Connection, Adescribed as "a lifestyle magazine

for Costco members," featured an article on a very hot topic going green. More and more lately I hear of people who decided to install solar panels on their homes, purchase energy efficient major appliances, and do more

recycling than in the past. Good! Anything we can do to help the environment is a positive thing ... right?

One of the things my family has done is to get and pay bills electronically. And for at least 30 years we've used canvas shopping bags for groceries. We've also changed as many of the light bulbs inside and outside the house as possible to the energy saving type, especially since those new lights can now be purchased in a three-way format, as well as bright white.

So, what can DOAI do to go green? Here's an idea: opt to receive this newsletter electronically instead of via the U.S. Postal Service. For starters, this could save some trees.

Not everyone will want to do this, I know. However, the cost savings in being able to receive an electronic newsletter is considerable, plus you don't have to pay to have the newsletter forwarded when you're not at home base. Therefore, I hope many of you will be willing to give it a try. How?

> First, send an email to DOAI's membership director, Portia Williams, telling her you want to opt out of getting the newsletter via postal delivery. Portia manages the mailing list for the newsletter, and she'll be glad to remove your name from that list. After giving this a

try, if you decide you'd rather have that hard copy delivered to you, just let her know and your name will go back on the list she emails to me each quarter.

Second, go to www.adobe.com and download a free program called Adobe Reader. When each issue of Discovery Express is sent to the printer, a copy is also emailed to Bob Cook, DOAI's webmaster, so it can be added to the other issues available online. These issues are PDF documents (Portable **D**ocument **F**ormat), which can be 'read' by Adobe Reader. You'll be able to read the issue online, and you can download it to your computer and print it out if you

Besides saving trees, there are other benefits to electronic newsletters. One is that if a significant number of members opt for the electronic version, we could reduce the number of copies printed per issue. For example, if 300 members opt out, it could reduce the annual printing

Humidity and Condensation by Neil Buschur, Fleetwood Owner Relations

A lthough it may not seem like it at first, staying in an RV will be different than living in your home. In order to have a pleasurable experience, especially when staying in your RV for an extended period of time, it is important to understand the effects of humidity and condensation and how to control them.

Effects

Condensation happens naturally. Just as moisture collects on the outside of a cold glass of water during humid weather, moisture can condense on the inside surfaces of your RV during cold weather when the humidity of the interior air is high. RVs are much smaller than a house and are tightly built; because of this, the interior air will become saturated with moisture much more quickly than a home.

The routine activities of a few people can put a lot of moisture in the air. In cooler weather this will show up as condensation on the interior windows; as the weather gets colder outside, it can show up as condensation on the interior walls, skylights and ceiling vents. If it gets cold enough, there could be frost on these areas. This can cause water stains or some serious damage on walls, woodwork, carpeting, ceiling material and even furniture. You might think your walls or ceiling are leaking. If you see these signs, you may have a problem with condensation and you need to do something to reduce the moisture.

Causes

Let's talk about where this condensation is coming from, because there are many sources:

- Meals prepared for a party of four can add up to a gallon of water a day to the air.
- An average shower can put between a one-quarter and one-half gallon of water to the air.
- Doing dishes from a typical day's meal can add up to one pound of water to the air.
- Floor mopping in a typical 8x10-foot galley can add almost two and one-half pounds of water to the air.
- Ten pounds of clothes, after being washed and spin dried, still contain about ten pounds of water.
- Propane appliances such as your stove and oven will release 88 gallons of water into the air for every 1,000 cubic feet of propane burned.
- Houseplants and aquariums give off almost as much water as you put on/in them.
- A large source of water in the RV is the inhabitants themselves. A party of four can put up to 12 pounds of water into an RV a day.

Water leaks from the outside obviously can be a big problem.

These are just some of the sources of humidity in the air. As you can see, just the normal course of living adds a great deal of moisture to the air inside your RV.

Prevention

What can you do to reduce or eliminate the condensation problem in your RV? The answer is to reduce moisture released into the air and to increase ventilation.

- ☆ Inspect the RV's exterior sealants on the roof and the sidewalls every three months, as stated in the owner's manual.
- Run the vent fan when cooking and the bath vent fan when bathing; let them run for a period of time after the meal or bath.
- Avoid making steam from excessive boiling or use of hot water.
- Remove snow or water from shoes before entering the RV to avoid soaking the carpet.
- Avoid drying clothes inside, except in the dryer.
- ☆ If you use vaporizing inhalers or similar devices, always provide adequate ventilation.
- Do not heat the RV interior with the range or oven.
- ☼ Never use an open flame propane or kerosene heater indoors. These devices release water into the air, and the exhaust gases contain poisonous substances.
- Wentilate with outside air; partially open outside roof vents and/or windows to provide circulation by adding outside air to the interior of the RV. While this will increase the heating load, it will greatly reduce condensation.
- Wentilate closets and cabinets. During use in cold weather, leave cabinet and closet doors partially open to warm and ventilate the interior of storage compartments. The airflow will reduce condensation.
- Avoid over crowding closets, wardrobe space, and storage cabinets; this will restrict airflow.
- Open window coverings and windows as often as possible and convenient.
- ☆ Keep heat registers and the furnace blower clean and unobstructed to allow better air circulation.

Remember, ventilation is important for making the interior of your RV comfortable. Using these suggestions will help make the RVing experience much more pleasurable for you and your family.

ave you had occasion to interact with a dealer or service technician that resulted in a good or even excellent experience? If so, this is the place to tell everyone about it. Here are two recent experiences:

Carl and Teri Dykman wrote: "The shear pin broke in the wardrobe slide on our 1999 37V while on a recent extended trip. This

was discovered in western Pennsylvania as we attempted to pull in the side. As a 'fix' we lodged a piece of wood between the slide and outer wall to keep the slide from opening as we went down the highway.

"Once we reached eastern Pennsylvania, we were given a name to contact, and they told us it would be two weeks before they could even look at it! So we called Fleetwood in Decatur, Indiana, and were given several names to call along the route we were going to be taking.

"On the first call, Beckley's Camping Center in Thurmont, Maryland, Sherry Moore in the service department took our name and phone number and promised to check with her crew and call us back. Long story short: we were able to get in that same day and in about 2½ hours were on our way down the highway, and their charge was very reasonable. Their philosophy is that people on the move don't want to spend days sitting at a repair facility.

"We highly recommend Beckley's Camping Center, 11109 Angleberger Road, Thurmont, MD 21788, 12 miles north of Frederick and six miles south of Thurmont, on Highway 15, which is just east of I-81; telephone 301.898.3300."

Claire Weber wrote: "In Goshen, Indiana, during the national rally, the pins that hold the car hitch to the RV went missing from the front of my car. I have since learned to not leave them there

"I looked up towing and RV supplies on one of the maps which were handed out at the rally. I called one, Dan's Service Center, 111 Alt Drive, Elkhart, IN; telephone 800.354.4824, and explained my problem. Dan said to come in the next day and he would make sure that I could get back to Texas. He was true to his word: he robbed the pins from a new package so that I could make the trip back home. He got right on the phone to his distributor in Houston to get them replaced.

"Dan's Service Center is indeed a good neighbor."


