Secretary's Report

BLUE RIDGE DISCOVERYS Chapter Meeting 29 January 2019 Seffner, Florida

Upon finalization of ceremony, President Money turned the meeting over to incoming President Jim Pinkerton.

RALLY REPORT:

President Pinkerton asked Southeastern Regional Vice President Kerry Pinkerton to provide an update to the Fall 2019 DOAI rally. The location has been finalized. The location is in Pueblo, Colorado at the Colorado State Fairgrounds. The dates are 09/23/2019 through 09/28/2019. Early arrivals can come to the rally as early as 09/20/2019 and late departure is on 09/29/2019. The budget has been approved and the facility will accommodate the attendees. Kerry reminded the chapter that volunteers will be asked to assist the hosting chapters.




