Secretary's Report

Chapter Meeting

29 January 2019

Seffner, Florida

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

President Money inquired if there were any corrections or additions needing made to the report. There were none. President Money called for a motion to accept the report. Bob Angus moved to accept the report and Frank Cason seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously to accept the minutes.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

SWEARING IN OF NEW OFFICERS:

Outgoing President Money introduced the incoming officers for 2019-2020. Jim Pinkerton, President; Tom Leydic, Vice President; Linda Terrill, Secretary; Laura Johnson, Assistant Secretary; Mike Hopkins, Treasurer; and Tim Ridgley, Rally Master. Upon introduction President Money asked the new officers to stand and participate in the swearing in ceremony. Upon finalization of ceremony, President Money turned the meeting over to incoming President Jim Pinkerton.

RALLY REPORT:

President Pinkerton asked Southeastern Regional Vice President Kerry Pinkerton to provide an update to the Fall 2019 DOAI rally. The location has been finalized. The location is in Pueblo, Colorado at the Colorado State Fairgrounds. The dates are 09/23/2019 through 09/28/2019. Early arrivals can come to the rally as early as 09/20/2019 and late departure is on 09/29/2019. The budget has been approved and the facility will accommodate the attendees. Kerry reminded the chapter that volunteers will be asked to assist the hosting chapters.

President Pinkerton asked Frank Cason to provide a report on the BRD Spring 2019 Rally. Frank reported the rally dates for the Spring 2019 Rally are 04/28/2019 through 05/05/2019. He discussed the need for as many members, who can, to attend as this is a working rally. There will be a catered welcome meal and a catered farewell meal at the rally. The rest of the meals will be on your own. He encouraged everyone to participate by going to the shows, restaurants, and activities in the area in order to make recommendations for the 2020 DOAI Rally. He discussed the golfing scheduled at Sevierville Golf Course, which has 2 courses. The courses are relatively new and he encouraged the golfers to participate.

Frank reminded those attending of the dates of the Spring 2020 BRD Rally. The Spring 2020 Rally dates are 04/26/2020 to 05/03/2020. The same rules apply to this rally as the Spring 2019 rally.

The DOAI 2020 Fall National Rally, which is to be hosted by BRD, is scheduled for 09/29/20 to 10/04/2020. Early arrival can start 09/26/2020.

OLD BUSINESS:

President Pinkerton referred to the previous minutes concerning possibly changing chapter shirt designs. He proposed this be discussed at an executive board meeting and presenting the findings at a general meeting.

The second subject addressed concerning allowing non-Discovery owners being allowed membership. President Pinkerton said the by-laws will need reviewed. He proposed the executive board review the by-laws and the findings will be presented at the next Chapter meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

Kerry Pinkerton reminded the chapter about the need for volunteer to consider becoming the National Regional Rally Master. He asked for all members to consider this position and if interested, please let him know.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:
