Discovery Friends

Hi fellow Discovery owners,

Recently the Discovery Owners Group, Inc, implemented a new program called Discovery Friends. This is based on a similar concept that is very popular in the GMC Motorhome world. Bob Cook (webmaster extraordinaire) and Bruce Plumb, and I developed the system.

I'm hoping that ALL members of Blue Ridge Discoveries will participate.

In a nutshell, Discovery Friends, is a spreadsheet containing basic contact information for people who are willing to help other Discovery owners who might need assistance or information and a map that shows the location of each member. YOU define what level of help you are willing to provide. It might be nothing more than a hot cup of coffee or a friendly face. It might be a parking pad. It might be help chasing parts or getting their family to a safe place while repairs are made. It might be knowledge of local repair shops, campgrounds, or places to eat. It might be help turning wrenches or making a repair. Etc. It is up to you what you offer.

Your information is behind the DOAI firewall and you must login to the site to get to it. Therefore, it is secure. No addresses are needed, just a name, city, state, phone and email, and a short blurb about what help you can provide.

Basically, you login to the site (<http://www.discoveryowners.com>) and click on the Forums tab. Then click on Discovery Friends. This will take you to: (<http://www.discoveryowners.com/doi.friends.asp>). This page contains the instructions for viewing the spreadsheet, entering your data, and seeing the map. There are actually three spreadsheets: Master List, Name Sort, and State Sort. The name and state sorts are done automatically and you can print them out and carry them in your coach or download to your PC. You enter your data at the next available row in the master list as the instructions describe.

There are samples of the various reports and map on the friends page. We prefer for folks to enter their own data but if you don't want to do that, you can send me an email with the information and I'll enter it for you. This concept only works if we have many members on the list.

Below is my information and another person's so you can see the range of things folks are willing to do. There is no commitment. If you get a call and can't help because of other plans or whatever, just explain the situation and the member can call someone else.

My temporary fix was to duct tape the openings every time I opened the slide.

Good news. Had the topper and ladder repaired today (23 Sep 2016). Ready to hit the road again tomorrow. (Mike Weiher)

Biking on the Keuka-Outlet Trail

Spending significant time in an RV presents challenges for staying physically fit. There are products and exercises available to us that allow us to maintain muscle tone. Walking and swimming are popular amongst RVers for aerobic exercise and heart health. A pool large enough and warm enough to swim laps isn't always available. Walking ranks right up there with a head cold for me, so I have taken to biking to get an aerobic workout. I try to stick to off-road trails to avoid a collision with people texting or otherwise being distracted while driving.

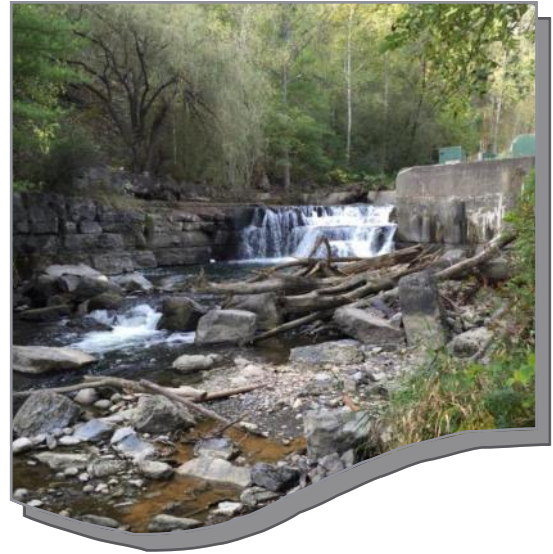
During the DOAI National Rally, I was researching the Rails to the Trails website (www.trailink.com) for trails near Bath, NY. Rails to Trails is a non-profit organization that seeks to develop public trails throughout the US. TrailLink is an excellent, free resource for finding walking, biking, or horseback riding trails near any selected location. I was looking for trails that would provide some scenery and a 10 to 15-mile round-trip distance to give me about an hour long workout with elevated pulse rate. I found the Keuka-Outlet Trail only 20 miles away. It was perfect, so off I went. I enjoyed my ride – well, most of it anyway - and learned a few things that I should have already known. The 7.5-mile Keuka-Outlet Trail runs parallel between a stream and what's left of a canal. The trail is bordered by lush vegetation along most of its length. There are two small, but scenic waterfalls along the way. The trail has an overall rating of four out of five stars by reviewers.

Historically, the trail's evolution dates back to the mid-1800s when two waterways connected the Keuka and Seneca lakes. One was the outlet stream originating at Keuka Lake and dropping about 270 feet to Seneca Lake. The other was the Crooked Lake Canal, built to carry commercial boat traffic between the lakes. Remnants of many mills that once harnessed the outlet's waterpower can still be seen along the stream. The area was settled in 1788. The Crooked Lake Canal was opened in 1833 to move products to eastern markets and was decommissioned in 1877. It consisted of 18 locks and took six hours to traverse. A railroad was built on the canal tow-path in 1844. It was called the "Corkscrew Railway" because of all the twists and turns along the stream. The line operated until 1972, when the tracks were washed out by the flood from Hurricane Agnes. The property was purchased by the village of Penn Yan in 1972, and the trail was developed and has been maintained by volunteers since then.



The experience of this ride provided me a few stark reminders of the consequences of neglect. I left home and realized our Fiesta low fuel light was illuminated – 1st neglectful mistake. I figured I'd get gas along the way. Well, there were no stations on the highway until I got to Penn Yan 20 miles north. I imagined running out of fuel and walking instead of driving. My imagination went wild, and I started thinking, "What if my bike breaks down on the trail and miles from the car?" I made it to Penn Yan, got gas, and arrived at the trail head in Penn Yan – 3rd mistake.

The 2nd was that I didn't take enough to drink. Never do that again! That 3rd mistake? Well, it's downhill from Penn Yan to Dresden, so the return trip was UPHILL. Add that to my dehydration, and the return trip wasn't nearly as pleasant at the downhill ride. It was only a 270-foot rise, but phew, it was tough! Then, about two miles short of my car I discovered mistake #4. I don't do a lot of routine maintenance on my bike and don't check it over before embarking on a ride. I just get on and go. I hit a bump, and the front wheel FELL OFF. Imagine my surprise. Me and my bike went crashing down. My first thought was of fellow RVer, Mike Hopkins, who also took a spill and had multiple leg fractures, so I immediately took inventory of broken bones. None. My left shin skinned up and my pride hurt, but I was otherwise ok. But I had to walk to the car. Remember the low gas issue? Reality Check. All in all, I had an enjoyable ride on a beautiful, historic trail. I learned to be less neglectful; to make sure I have enough gas (duh); to take enough liquids to stay hydrated (double, duh); to ride the hard part first; and checkout my equipment. Riding is great exercise. Find and ride on trails, and always be safe. **(Courtesy of Rick Blaher)**



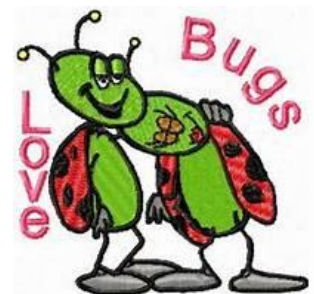
Love Bugs!

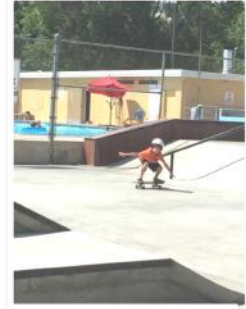

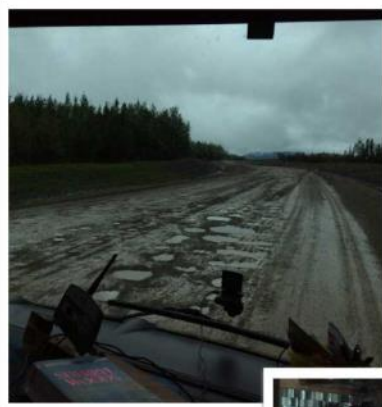

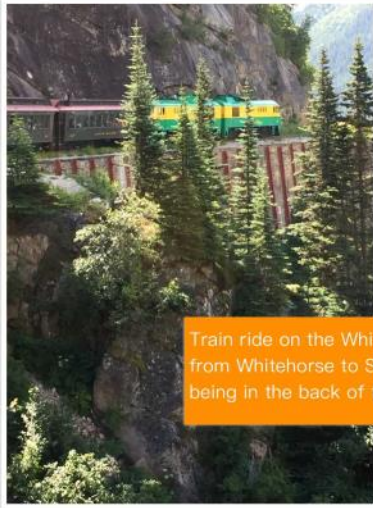

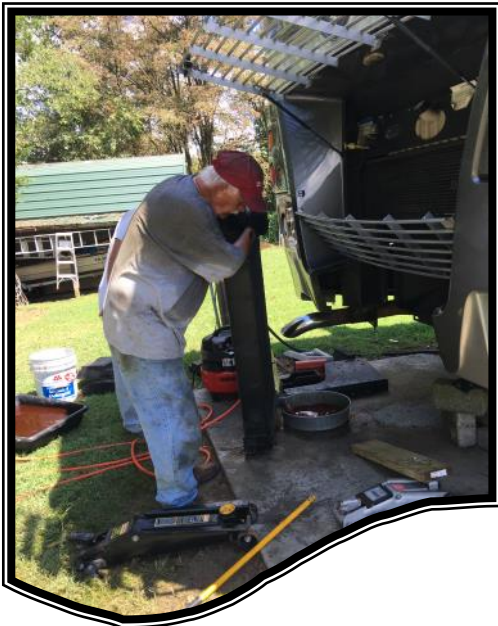

Crock Pot Mac & Cheese

8 oz Elbow macaroni – cooked and drained
1 (12 oz) can evaporated milk
1 1/2 cups milk
1 Teaspoon salt
1 cup mild or medium cheddar cheese – grated
2 cups sharp cheddar cheese – grated
1/2 cup (one stick) melted butter
2 Eggs beaten

Spray crock pot with non-stick spray. In a large bowl, combine all ingredients. Pour mixture into crock pot.

Cook on low for 3 1/2 hours. DO NOT STIR. DO NOT OPEN.

Note: I use more than 3 cups of cheese. I use a little extra in the mixture and I use probably a cup or more to cover the top. My kids love the extra cheese.

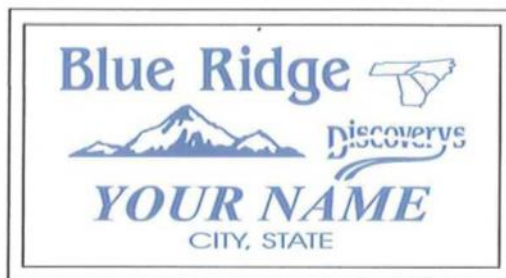

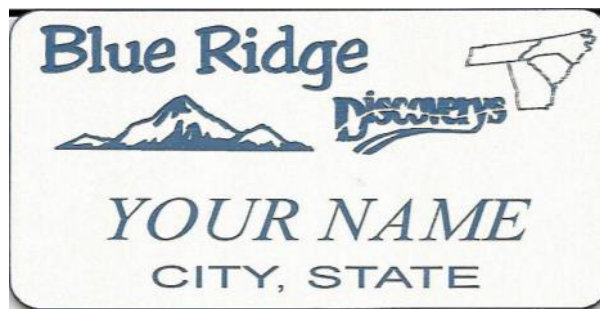
