**BY LAWS OF
BLUE RIDGE DISCOVERYS
A CHAPTER OF THE
DISCOVERY OWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC.**



ARTICLE I – NAME

The name of this chapter shall be the **BLUE RIDGE DISCOVERYS** chapter of the Discovery Owners Association, Inc. The Chapter is formed as part of the Discovery Owners Association, Inc., a non-profit, volunteer organization.

ARTICLE II – PURPOSE

The purpose of the chapter is to plan campouts, enhance camaraderie and to promote social contact among Discovery Owners. The Chapter primarily services DOAI members residing in Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Tennessee, but membership is open to all DOAI members.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP AND FEES

Section 1. Any person or family who owns a Discovery Motorhome and is a qualified member of the Discovery Owners Association Inc. is eligible for membership in the **BLUE RIDGE DISCOVERYS** Chapter. Both Pilot and Co-pilot shall have membership and voting privileges.

Section 2. The annual dues for the **BLUE RIDGE DISCOVERYS** Chapter shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00) a year. A member joining after January will pay a prorated amount equal to one dollar and twenty five cents (\$1.25) per month for the remainder of the year. Dues are due to the Treasurer by the 15th day of January each year. These dues were recommended by the chapter officers and accepted by the founding chapter members. Ten percent (10%) of these dues shall be remitted annually to the Treasury of the Discovery Owners Association, Inc. This amount will remain in effect, until changed by the membership.

Section 3. Regular meetings or campouts of the chapter shall be held at least quarterly. The dates and times will be set by the Chapter officers.

Section 4. Special meetings of the membership may be called by the President or any two officers upon notification to all members five days prior to the meeting.

Section 5. Twenty-five (25) % of the total membership shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE IV – AUTHORITY

Section 1. The Chapter Officers shall be the administrative body of the Chapter and shall also perform such functions and duties as ordered by the Chapter.

Section 2. Any vacancy (ies) shall be filled by the officers for the unexpired term.

Section 3. The Chapter Officers shall hold meetings as they deem necessary, and the President or any two officers may at any time call a meeting.

Section 4. A majority of the officers shall constitute a quorum to hold a meeting on any specific item. Absent officers may mail their vote, if appropriate, to the Chapter Secretary prior to the meeting date.

ARTICLE V – OFFICERS

The officers of the Chapter are the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer Assistant Treasurer and Rally Master. The officers shall constitute the Board and shall perform the duties that usually pertain to these respective offices. Only one (1) family member can hold office and serve on the board, at the same time. They shall be elected by the Chapter members at the annual meeting, and shall hold office for two (2) years or until a successor has been duly elected and installed.

Section 1. The Assistant Treasurer will be a Non-voting position on the board. This position will be kept abreast of all financial activities by the Treasurer and be prepared to assume the duties of the Treasurer.

Section 2. The outgoing President will become a member of the board and will serve until the next President is elected.

ARTICLE VI – COMMITTEES

Section 1. The nominating committee shall consist of three members appointed by the President in September. The chairman of the nominating committee shall present the proposed slate of officers at the next meeting. Nominations will also be accepted from the floor. Election of officers will take place at the November/December annual meeting.

Officers will assume their duties as of the following January 1.

Section 2. Other committees may be appointed by the President and shall act for the duration of their assigned task.

ARTICLE VII – FINANCES

Section 1. The fiscal year shall be the calendar year.

Section 2. All funds of the chapter shall be deposited at Wells Fargo Bank NA (Formally Wachovia Bank) to the account of the **BLUE RIDGE DISCOVERYS**.

Section 3. The President shall appoint a committee of at least (3) members to conduct an annual audit of the “clubs” finances. This audit will be performed at the fall rally annually.

ARTICLE VIII – BY LAWS

Section 1. Amendment of bylaws.

a. Changes to the bylaws may be proposed, in writing, to the Chapter Secretary, by any member. With the approval of the Board, such proposed changes will be mailed or e-mailed to all chapter members.

b. Proposed changes to the bylaws will be mailed to each member thirty days prior to the meeting for which announcement has been made that a bylaws amendment will be presented. The bylaws may then be amended with a 2/3 majority vote on the Chapter members present AND VOTING.

Section 2. Standing Rules may be written to address other Chapter procedures. In case of a conflict, the Chapter bylaws take precedence over the Chapter Standing Rules.

Section 3. This chapter will operate under the bylaws and standing rules of the Discovery Owner Association, Inc., which shall take precedence over this document.

ARTICLE IX – TERMINATION OF CHAPTER

If the activities of the chapter terminate, any property or Chapter funds shall be donated to DOAI, a non-profit organization.

NOTE: This document has been approved as written by a majority of Blue Ridge Discoverys Member at the annual business meeting on September 20, 2012

BOARD APPROVES TWO STANDING RULES

The Board met in a special meeting on September 22, 2012 to approve two standing rules

Standing Rule #1

A. The Board approved BRD logo shall be as depicted per the sample below.

1. This official logo will appear on clothing, correspondence, publications, advertisements and other official Chapter materials only as approved by the Board.
2. The color and size of the logo may be adjusted with the approval of the Board to suit any particular use.
3. Only merchandise sold by vendor(s) approved by the Board may carry the official logo.
4. Our name, Blue Ridge Discoverys, cannot be used in any form of logo other than shown below.



Standing Rule #2

A. Vendors **who are not** BRD members may attend Chapter rallies subject to the following:

1. Board approval must be obtained by the Vendor before submitting a rally registration form
2. If Board approval is granted, the Vendor may then submit a rally registration form and will pay any required rally fee(s) and other costs associated with the rally. If the rally is free or if meals or other activities are supported in part by the Chapter, the Vendor must pay the cost of the meals or activities in an amount set by the Board.

BOB DEAL'S OUTSIDE POLELIGHT

Thanks to Bob Deal, a member of the Mason-Dixon Discoverys, who was kind enough to let me publish the instructions for this beautiful polelight.

PARTS LIST

1. One 3 In X 5 Ft PVC Pipe for Post	\$7.48
2. One 1 3/4 In X 5 Ft PVC Pipe (you need 15" of it for Cross Bar)	1.73
3. Two 3/4 Inch end caps @ .35 ea	.70
4. PVC 3" X 2" coupling	3.07
5. One 3 Inch Level Fit Closet Flange	4.63
6. Post Lantern , Model # 0356742 (Black or White)	<u>19.98</u>
TOTAL	\$37.59

Parts were purchased from Lowes. PVC is located in plumbing department. Don't forget to ask for your **discount** if you are active or retired military.

Instructions

Cut, drill, dry assemble to check fit before gluing, and paint all parts before assembly.

Drill a 3/4" hole through the center of the 5' PVC **post** for the **cross bar**. Bob suggests drilling through both sides, it's more accurate, and your cross bar will be straight. Drill the holes for the cross bar 6" down from where the bottom of the **Post Lantern** will be. After the **cross bar** is in place through the post, place an **end cap** on each end. Before mounting the coupling to the top of the post, wrap the 2" part of the coupler with duck tape for a tight fit (about 20 times). Cut off excess tape with a razor knife. Put the PVC 3" X 2" inch coupling on the top of the post.

Mount the **Closet Flange** to a 1 ft X 1 ft piece of exterior plywood so it will stand and then mount it to the bottom of the post using plumbers glue. Drill a hole in each corner so nail pegs can be driven in the ground to secure the lamppost.

Mount the **Post Lantern** to the **lamppost**. The **lantern** has two screw holes at the bottom of the base. Put the **lantern** on the **post** and mark the hole location. Drill two small holes. You are now ready for the electrical work. There is a good wiring diagram in the owner's manual of the **lantern** box. You will need approximately 6 feet of electric wire and a male plug. On the bottom of the **post**, about 1 in. above the **closet flange**, drill a hole a little larger than the wire. Run the wire from the bottom of the **post**, up to the **lantern top**, and complete the wiring. Bob has a long drop cord that he runs from my **lamppost** to an outlet in a storage bay.

Bob used white PVC pipe for his **lamppost**, and painted it mat black. He painted the end caps gold. Put your Lamppost at the corner of your campsite where you get the best light to your entry door.

Congratulations! Now you can find your way home at night.

ANOTHER OPTION FOR AN OUTSIDE POLE LIGHT

Charlie Harvell also had an amazing outside light. He admits that he purchased his solar LED lamp post at an FMCA rally a few years ago.

It is made using a 1" square post 48" long. With the solar lamp the total length is 58". A solar light for the top can be found at Lowe's. You can add your own attachments such as a garden flag rod or have a name plate added. Elaine and Charlie added a name plate using letters cut from a mirror. They also added an art design out of cast metal on the other side.

When Charlie uses the post he slides the square post over a rod driven into the ground as he is doing with his PVC flag post. The solar lamp will burn for up to 8 hours depending on how much sun it receives. (Charlie Harvell)

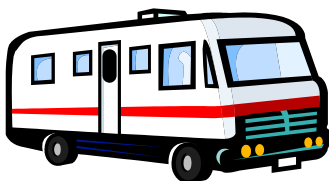
"Hi, Gang!

FOR THE COOK

"Mom's Baked Beans"

- 1 (28-oz.) can Van Camps Pork & Beans
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1/3 bottle chili sauce
- 1/4 cup dark molasses
- 1/3 cup brown sugar
- 3 Tblsp. prepared yellow mustard
- 2-3 strips bacon

Mix all in casserole dish. Cover. Bake @ 350* for 1 hour with the top on, and 45 min to 1 hour with the top off.

For the rally, I bought 2 "Institutional size" (7 lb.2 oz) cans, and that was 8 times the recipe. Of course, using the roaster, I couldn't do the "lid off" baking, which is why they were 'soupier' than normally would have been.

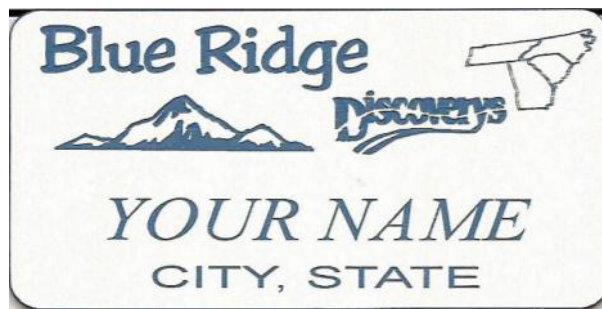
