Schedule

I know that some of you are members of both Mason Dixon and the Blue Ridge Discoverys and will already have this, but I wanted to share it again since the DOAI Discovery Express was delayed and it may be a few days before you receive the information in that newsletter. (Glenda)

As some of you may know, the DOAI Discovery Express Newsletter was delayed pending a decision about cancelling or postponing the 2020 National Rally in Sevierville which Blue Ridge Discoverys are hosting. The board voted to cancel the 2020 rally and it was rescheduled for 2021. For your information, I am including the new dates regarding the 2021 rally for which the Blue Ridge Discoverys will still be responsible.

The 2021 DOAI National Rally will be at the same place, same resort with rally dates of **20-26 September 2021**. The price of \$67.65 per night will remain in effect. Early arrival for everyone is 17 September "or" 19 September 2021. There will be "NO ARRIVALS" on 18 September because of parades, car shows, and craft fairs in Sevierville. As a consequence, you have a choice of either one or three days early arrival. The cutoff date for 20-26 September and early registration is **23 August 2021**.

Again, the rally begins 20 September and the departure date is **26 September 2021**. At the same rate you may stay two extra days, the 26th and 27th, leaving on 28 September. However, only 50 sites are set aside for late departure days and you must register for the late days **NLT 26 July 2021**. If you do **NOT** register prior to 26 July and specify the late days, you will **NOT** get the rally rate. **NOTE:** do not put any late days on your registration form **after** 26 July 2021 as they will be deleted and you will have to call the Resort to register for those days and pay the normal rate.

Hopefully by that time this virus will have run its course or a vaccine will be developed. However, be prepared to bring mask for everyone's safety in the event there are still problems. Hopefully, all individuals who registered or indicated in the surveys that they would be present at the DOAI 2020 National Rally, will attend in 2021. Blue Ridge Discoverys will continue our planning to make this a memorable event."


Old Mill Stream

Washer Challenges!

My original equipment, a Whirlpool washing machine, has given me trouble the last few years. It is very difficult to remove the washer for service or repairs so when it recently failed, I decided to replace it with a slightly larger and better rated GE machine with larger capacity. The challenge was fitting the new machine in the existing space due to its longer depth.

The first photo shows the space with the old washer and dryer removed. The plumbing took up too much room for the new machine to fit. The second picture shows the plumbing and electrical relocated to the adjacent closet and the last picture on the next page shows the new washer in place. I should have the dryer in place and remaining trim work done soon.

The estimate from a plumber to do the work was three hundred dollars to relocate the supply and drain lines. After moving the electrical and putting in standard outlets myself, I decided to also install the plumbing. Nothing very difficult.



PARTY POTATO SALAD

(Serves 20)

Ingredients:

5 lbs. red potatoes, chopped

3 cups mayonnaise

2 cups finely chopped pickles

5 hard cooked eggs, chopped

1/2 cup chopped red onion

1.2 cup chopped celery

3 Tbs. prepared mustard

1 Tbs. apple cider vinegar

1 tsp. salt, or to taste

1/2 tsp. ground black pepper

Preparation:

Place potatoes in a large pot and cover with salted water. Bring to a BOIL and then reduce heat to MEDIUM LOW and SIMMER until tender, about 10 minutes. Drain and return potatoes to pot to dry.

Stir all of the next ingredients together in a large bowl. Fold potatoes into the mayonnaise mixture, cover and chill, at least 6 hours, preferably overnight, before serving.

Notes:

Prep 20 minutes; cook time 10 minutes; Chill 6 hours plus.

Calories: 339; Carbs: 20.4 Grams; Sodium: 538 mg

If serving at a picnic or potluck, consider placing potato salad bowl on a larger container of ice cubes to help keep it cold. Stir salad every 15 minutes.

Consider puting out 1/2 the salad and keep the remainder refrigeration until first half is nearly gone. Sprinkle top of bowl with some chopped, fresh parsley or basil if desired

Refrigerate any leftovers in closed container.
