The Noreaster Discoverys and Midwest Discoverers held a fun filled Spring Rally in the heart of Pennsylvania Dutch Country at Flory's Campground in Ronks, PA from 5/21 – 5/25. Amish Farms and Homesteads surrounded us and our trusty D's and SOB's, and the occasional pungent aromas of the fields being prepared for planting let us know that our neighbors were hard at work.

Thankfully, the air conditioning in Luigi's Lounge came to the rescue especially on those 95° days! The campground location made it easy to get out and explore the area. Many of us enjoyed driving around the countryside amongst the Amish in their horse drawn buggies, enjoying the Amish hospitality, the beauty of the farmlands and, of course, the numerous shopping opportunities. Val and Les were thrilled that their quest for locating the elusive miniature horses was successful.

I'm happy to say that the Rally tradition of eating too much and laughing too loudly was in evidence throughout our short time together. We all enjoyed the campground visit from the Amish woman who was selling her homemade baked goods. Many of us flocked to her wagon to make our purchases. I can personally attest that the sticky buns were delicious! It was so much fun spending time with our fellow chapter owners. The fellowship and camaraderie of this group can't be topped. As expected, the activities planned by Rally hosts Pat and Russ Baldwin highlighted the Amish and German heritage of the area. We toured the Landis Valley Village and Farm Museum, a 'living history' village highlighting early Pennsylvania German/Dutch life led by a costumed interpreter. We enjoyed exploring the beautifully restored buildings and the extensive collection of historical agricultural equipment.

Our guided tour of the Wolf Sanctuary of Pennsylvania, in Lititz was the highlight of the rally for some. This family owned refuge cares for over 50 gray wolves and wolf-dogs on its 80 plus acres of natural woodland. Our friendly and knowledgeable guide was a treasure trove of information about the refuge and the individual animals. Two special wolves warmed the hearts of many of us. One loved to be petted by the guide, as he had originally been a family pet. Moving wheels fascinated the other. This wolf tracked the movement of members who were using a rolling walker and powered scooter to descend a rather steep hill. Quite the sight.

We learned a little bit about Amish life at the Amish Experience and enjoyed the surround theater experience of Jacob's Choice at the Plain and Fancy Farm. We also were thrilled to enjoy a delicious homemade meal at the Amish home of Samuel and Ruth Lapp. The dinner was served family style and was absolutely delicious. Who can forget that amazing strawberry jam! We loved the food and learned a little more about the everyday life of Amish families. Quite a unique experience for many of us.

Hello MW Discoverers!

Greetings from sunny SE Michigan.

I hope your summer is going well despite the challenges we've all faced. I heard all the great news from the spring rally in PA – thanks again to Pat and Russ and the others who invested so much in making it a great time for everyone – and I'm still bummed that Ruth and I weren't able to participate.

We do plan to make it to our fall rally in Wisconsin, and I hope you're able to go too. Please see the notes about that below – you must get a registration and check to Jeanne before August 10<sup>th</sup>. I'd not rely on the snail mail at this point – send Jeanne an email right now to hold your spot while you get your stuff in the mail to her.

For those of you who may have missed the news, Chris Wooddell caught the dreaded SOB virus and now drives some non-disco piece of junk. He is now a probationary member of the MW chapter and I've been forced to take over as interim president of this fine organization. More on this below.

### Rally Planning

We need to make some rally decisions for 2023 pretty quickly. I'd like to have the ball rolling on this before our September rally in WI so here are some things to think about:

- The 2023 DOAI national rally has been moved to OH due to the inability to secure a park big enough in the NE. That puts it in our MW home turf though NE is still technically the lead chapter. MW and NE have been in a close partnership due to significantly overlapping memberships for some time. NE is a small chapter and even if the national rally wasn't in OH, we'd still expect to help them with hosting duties as much as we can.
- Given the above, it's been suggested, and I agree, that a MW/NE spring rally in the Ohio area would be a good idea to help move things along for the national. I need someone to step up to at least coordinate park selection

- and reservations (for a host-less rally), or even take on full rally host responsibilities. We can keep it simple. Please let me know if you can do this.
- We also need to start working on plans for the fall 2023 rally as well. Since the national is in OH, we can probably go anywhere in our region and still be conveniently close to national. Please let me know if you can get the planning started for this. We had talked about a possible Washington DC rally (which is a bit outside the MW turf). I still think this would be fun but given the cost of the park, we'd have to have a substantial subsidy from the chapter for it to work for many folks. I'm open to thoughts and alternatives.
- Fall Rally Elections
- According to our bylaws, we're supposed to have President and VP elections on even years. This fall will be the end of my two-year term and we'd elect to both roles for the next two years. I should have formed a nomination committee this past spring to bring a slate to the fall rally.
- Since that didn't happen, we'll have to take nominations from the floor and vote at our business meeting. I'd like to have some folks, including new members, volunteer to be considered for these roles. We have several past presidents available to do coaching and mentoring. Please send me a note if you're even slightly interested no strings attached.
- National Rally MW Representation
- Ruth and I won't be able to go to the national rally in WY this fall. We will need someone from MW who is going to sit in on the chapter presidents' meeting and take some notes. Please let me know if you can do this for me.
- Again, I hope this note finds you healthy and enjoying a better summer than the past couple. I look forward to seeing you in Wisconsin if you can make it.
